Wildlife Rescue & Rehabilitation

This is one of many Petrels that have been brought in recently. At this time of year they are often found inland when they are blown off course by rough weather. Occasionally they sustain injuries but most of the time they benefit from fluids and rest and can then be released after 1 – 3 days. If you see a Petrel on the beach it is best to not disturb them as they often come ashore to rest or moult. If you are concerned that it may be injured, it may be best to bring it in to make sure it can get the treatment that it needs. Always handle them gently using a towel to enclose their wings and cover their head to help prevent damage from their powerful and sharp beaks. Put them into a well ventilated box for transport and minimize noise.



In December we took in a total of **104** birds. For the year of 2014 we took in a total of **629** birds.

Community Cat Project (CCP)



These two tiny fluff balls are just a few days old, they came in near the start of December without a mother as she is a feral cat and had deserted these two kittens. They went home with one of our dedicated foster parents to get bottle fed every few hours until they are able to eat solid food. These beautiful kittens will be ready for adoption in about a months' time, which is when they will be old enough to be de-sexed, micro chipped and vaccinated.

During December we have adopted out **23** cats and kittens to loving homes.

We have de-sexed **38** cats and kittens and taken a total of **44** off the streets.

Since ARRC started this project in September 2012 we have taken a total of **987** cats off the streets.

These gorgeous kittens, "Autumn, Spring & Midnight" were rescued at 6 days old, they spent over 2 months being loved and looked after by one of our amazing foster parents. They are now 10 weeks old and looking for families to adopt them.
